# **Ashburton Aviation Museum**

## Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2023

The HECC Committee planned for us to have a lunch get-together and then a visit to the Ashburton Aviation Museum.

The meet was at Rolleston Supercheap Auto and then a drive through to Ashburton. Plenty of traffic on SH 1, including the dozen or so police cars south of Rolleston. We all had lunch at Cleavers Corner. Definitely worth a lunch stop if you are ever hungry in Ashburton.

We then set off to the Ashburton airfield, to wander around their aviation treasures. For an affordable \$10 per adult and children free, it is a really fascinating place, for the plane enthusiasts, or non-enthusiasts.



## A bit of history:

In August 1939, the Air Force Mobilisation scheme proposed that No.3 Elementary Flying Training School be established at the Ashburton Airfield.

Having 173 personnel, including 46 Trainee Pilots, it was to be in operation 18 weeks after the outbreak of hostilities. However, owing to the shortage of aircraft and Flying Instructors, it was not until February 1942 that work on the new base commenced.

Initially, the buildings were sited well away from the airfield, camouflaged among trees, because of the fear of Japanese air attack.

By September 1942 the greatly enlarged airfield was ready, and in October, No.2 E.F.T., then based at New Plymouth, began moving its Tiger Moth training aircraft and personnel South to Ashburton. Flying training began on the 22nd of October, with the 136 Trainee Pilots of Course's 33 & 34 using 47 Tiger Moths and 30 Instructors.

By mid-1943 the danger of air attack had passed, the buildings moved to a site close to the airfield and the base was upgraded to cater for the 900 plus personnel then on the Station. The Air Force's need for pilots had greatly reduced and in October 1944 it was decided that the base would be closed. In its two years of operation, RNZAF Station Ashburton had trained 1192 Pilots, it's aircraft had flown in excess of 100,000 hours, 17 aircraft were destroyed, 120 other damaged, and sadly, five Airmen had lost their lives.

The museum is spread over two very large buildings, and they are in the process of fundraising to build another building, as they have more treasures to put on display. This is the perfect place to take children, and also those adults who like to climb in and touch the displays. You have to commend those Pilots, as their seats in some of those crafts were not built for comfort or space.






# **Ashburton Aviation Museum**

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2023

Some of the crafts on display were; DH 82A Tiger Moth, British Aerospace Hawker Siddley Harrier (Jump Jet), a replica of Richard Pearce's plane, Aermacchi MB339-CB, North American T-28B Trojan, Douglas DC3-C47 [where you can walk up the steps and into the DC3, and then walk up the aisle to the air steward's area beside the cockpit. The DC3 was flying up to January 2014 before the Southern DC3 Trust sold it to the museum. I was impressed with this one, as I have flown out of Wigram airfield in this DC3 in a scenic flight around Christchurch], McDonnell Douglas Skyhawke, BAC 167 StrikeMaster, Cessna 421B Golden Eagle [used by the Royal Flying Doctor Service, West Australian Section from October 1975 – October 1986], and a Royal New Zealand Airforce plane.

You can walk up the steps into the DC3, down the aisle to the air steward's area, and take a look inside the cockpit. The DC3 was flying up to January 2014 before the Southern DC3 Trust sold it to the museum. I was impressed with this one, as I have flown out of Wigram airfield in this DC3 on a scenic flight around Christchurch.

For those who love a bit of history, you can also try your hand at sending some morse code words. They also have an ATR72 flight simulator for those who want to experience flying.

We left the museum and headed east along Seafield Road, to figure out how big this airfield was in 1942. From the airfield to where the barracks ended at Singletree Road, it is 1.1km. Imagine walking that in full camo gear at the end of your shift!
